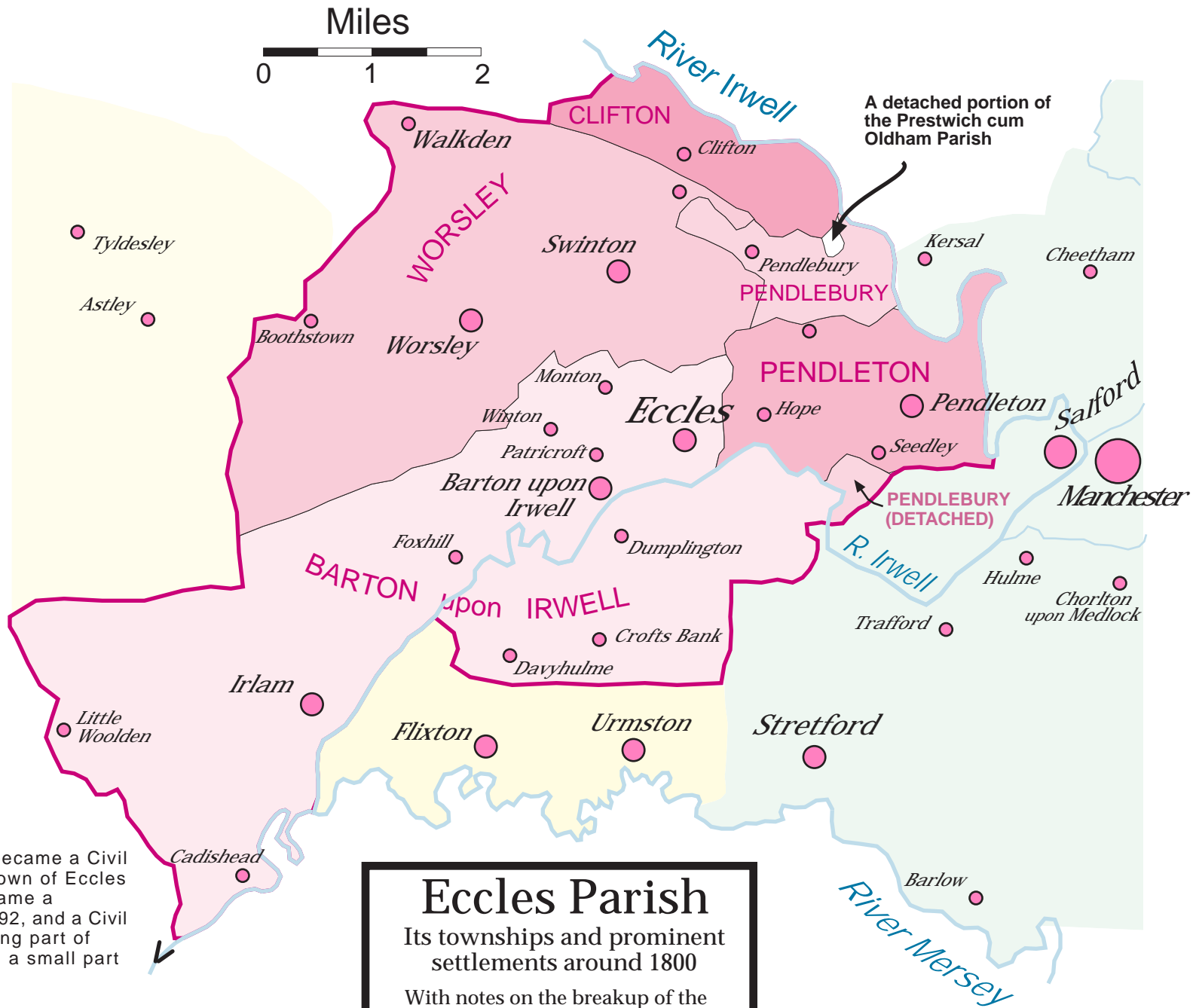
Notes:

The mother church of Eccles Parish was (and is) St Mary the Virgin. Its origins may precede 1066.

Many of the towns in the Eccles Ecclesiastical Parish (EP) became centres of separate EP's in the 1800's. These included:

- Swinton (St Peter) 1806
- Pendleton 1807
- Pendlebury 1843
- Worsley 1847
- Barton upon Irwell 1849
- Walkden Moor 1863
- Irlam 1867
- Patricroft 1869
- Clifton in 1875

When Barton upon Irwell became a Civil Parish (CP) in 1866, the town of Eccles lost its civic status. It became a Metropolitan Borough in 1892, and a Civil Parish in 1894, re-absorbing part of Barton upon Irwell CP and a small part of Worsley CP.
