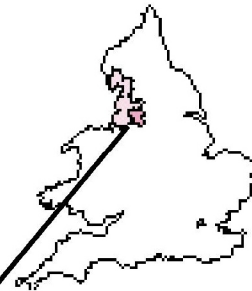

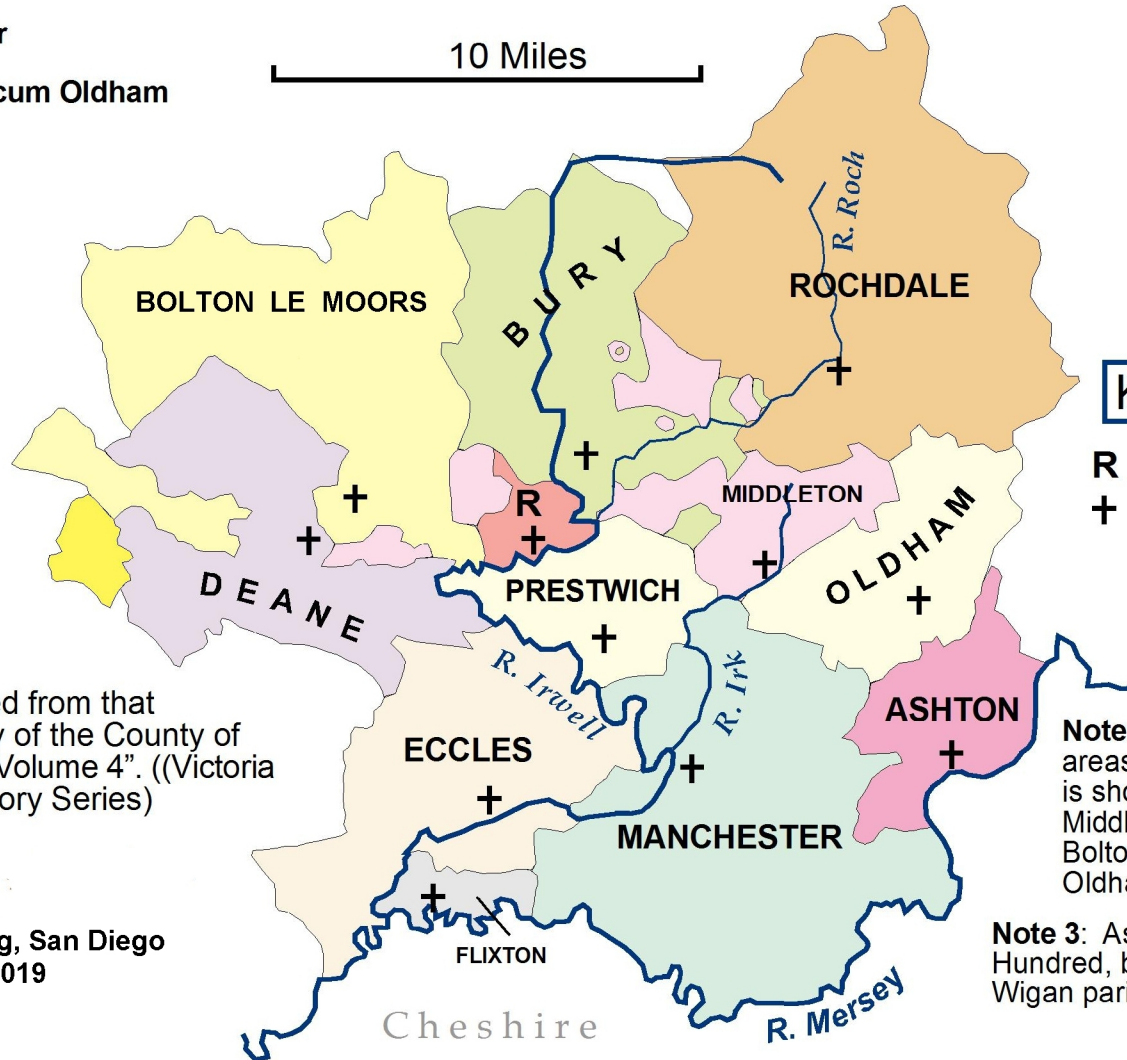

Note 1: Prestwich and Oldham form a single parish -- Prestwich cum Oldham

Note 2: Some parishes controlled areas that were not contiguous. This is shown by the sharing of colour. Middleton has 7 pieces, Bury 3 pieces, Bolton 2 pieces, Prestwich cum Oldham 2 pieces.

Note 3: Aspull is a township in the Salford Hundred, but attached ecclesiastically to Wigan parish in the West Derby Hundred
